Memory, migration and the selves we become

ALYCIA PIRMOHAMED

Thrumming with poetic vitality and questions about the legacies of migration, *Shorelines* is the winner of the Nan Shepherd Prize for nature writing and the non-fiction debut by Alycia Pirmohamed

As a young Muslim woman Alycia Pirmohamed grew up with her body as racialised and her faith as seemingly dangerous. Her affinity to the natural world – the mountains, elk and pines of her childhood – conflicted with feelings that she was unwelcome in these landscapes. By contrast, the stories of her parents' homeland – the monsoon winds, red clay roads and abundant korosho trees – felt painfully distant.

Across interrelated pieces that move from Midwestern Canada to East Africa, the Pacific Northwest to the British Isles, the award-winning poet traces the legacies of migration and memory on her life, examining the idea of homeland and the mythmaking it demands. She creatively resists the expectations of nature writing and memoir, at times choosing to withhold as much as she reveals.

Shorelines moves from lavender skies to lighthouses, from surefooted ideas to liminal spaces. It asks what it means to carry hidden histories across borders and generations – and how losing family can mean losing the place they are from too. Above all, it explores how place and identity intertwine, and how our choices, our actions and the ways we build community shape us into who we become.

How Her Lost Year Helped Me to Live Again

One winter, Cathy Rentzenbrink – one of the UK's most beloved writers and bookworms – finds herself too exhausted to open another novel. Drained by the upheavals of her life, and in need of comfort and escape, she turns to the books of her first literary love: Agatha Christie. She soon becomes obsessed by the central mystery of Agatha's life – how she disappeared following the death of her mother and the breakdown of her marriage.

The more Cathy delves into Agatha's struggles, the more she realises how much the two have in common and how much her heroine has to tell her about surviving the hard times and starting life on her own terms. A young French photographer travels to Palestine to report on the bombings in Gaza. One morning, during a ceasefire, he wanders far from his hotel into the narrow alleys of the city. Roaming aimlessly, he stumbles across a bookseller sitting on the doorstep of his shop – an old man, surrounded by stacks of books. As the photographer raises his camera, the bookseller calls out to him and asks him to listen to his story, not simply take his picture.

The story that unfolds is one that encompasses exile and imprisonment, activism and political disillusionment, the joys of love and art and watching your children grow up and thrive, and the tragedies that tear your loved ones from you. Each event is tied to the book that helped him understand and, in some cases, survive it, from Milan Kundera to Frantz Fanon to Umberto Eco to Ernest Hemingway, among many others. There's a saying that when an old man dies a library burns, and it's this very library that the bookseller opens and describes.

Rachid Benzine gives us a magnificent modern tale that explores the power of words against barbarism, of books as the last bastions of resistance against the loss of empathy, of literature as a means of sustenance during our darkest hours.

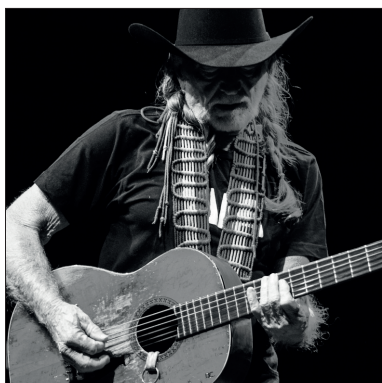
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Willie Nelson is an American musician. He lives in Austin, Texas.

Willie Nelson is 92, and he has not been slowing down. In the past 12 years, he has recorded 17 new studio albums, written 36 new songs and headlined over 400 live shows. What has been going on? With his trademark down-home wit, Nelson opens up and brings us in touch with the same inexhaustible, vital stream of energy he has learned how to stay tapped into.

'Looking to the future as I look to the past,' he writes, 'I stay in the present.' That captures the spirit of *The Last Leaf*: forging ahead. It also flashes back to life-altering moments, including facing almost certain death during Covid and what Nelson gained from that.

Woven into his recollections of his own life as an artist is his beautiful and often hilarious account of how the fiery spirit of Annie, his wife and best friend for four decades, has matched his own.
